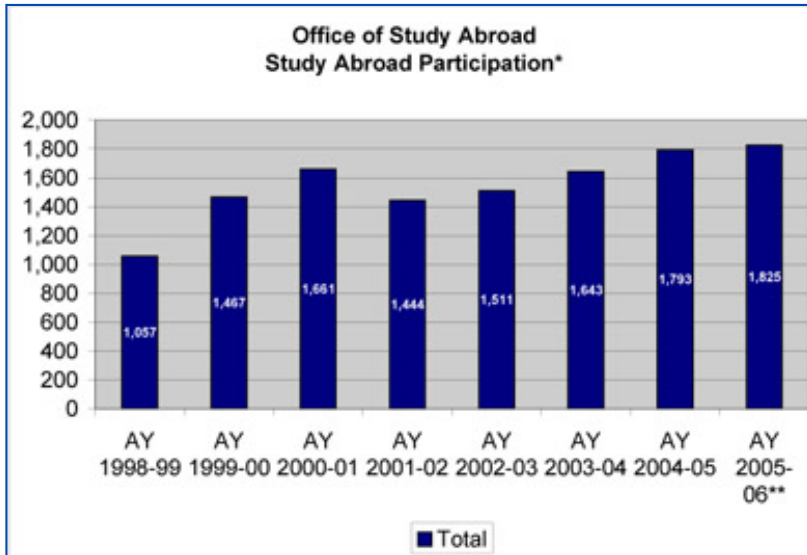

## STUDENT COMMUNITY SERVICE<sup>10</sup>

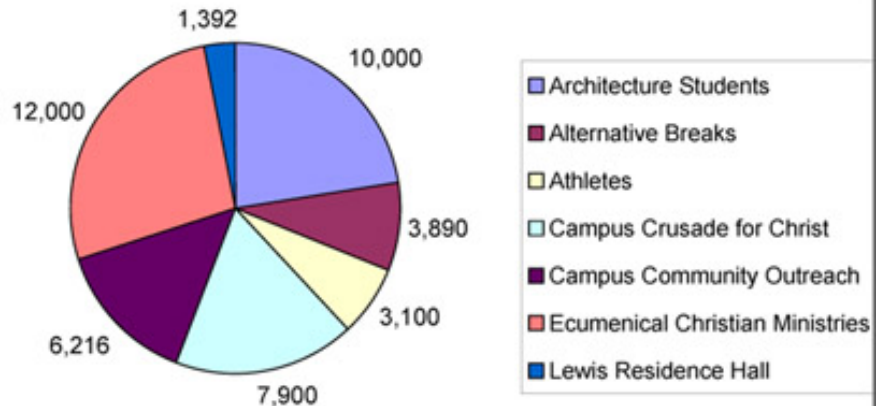
(Main Campus)

•Close to 7,000 University of Kansas students donated their time to community service projects during the 2005-06 academic year, earning the university a spot on the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll.

•According to data compiled by KU's [Center for Service Learning](#), approximately 6,937 KU students participated in community service projects during the past academic year. More than half of those students contributed 20 hours or more to the projects. More than 600 students contributed more than 20,000 hours to Hurricane Katrina relief efforts. KU students and staff also donated close to \$55,000 to the relief efforts.
